

SHADES OF ORANGE ►



▲ GLASS PARTITIONS

"Open-plan living is on the way out. Opt out of removing all walls in a space and think about using glass dividers instead. They offer up separation of spaces but still filter all the light. Glass partitions with metal frames also create a lofty vibe in a space and make for a stunning statement. The look is a little more industrial and commercial, but there are ways of warming up the look to ensure it works in residential settings. A cost-saving trick is to just build pony walls that go half-way up and then add in a glass portion for the top half, also creating a striking look."
